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Proverbs Chapters 1-9, 22:17–24:34 "The Sayings of the Wise" - Categorised

(New Living Translation)

1:1 These are the proverbs of Solomon, David's son, king of Israel.

2 Their purpose is to teach people wisdom and discipline, to help them understand the insights of the wise.
3 Their purpose is to teach people to live disciplined and successful lives, to help them do what is right, just, and fair.
4 These proverbs will give insight to the simple, knowledge and discernment to the young.
5 Let the wise listen to these proverbs and become even wiser.
Let those with understanding receive guidance
6 by exploring the meaning in these proverbs and parables, the words of the wise and their riddles.

Wisdom

1:7 Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline.

1:20 Wisdom shouts in the streets.

She cries out in the public square.

21 She calls to the crowds along the main street, to those gathered in front of the city gate:

22 'How long, you simpletons, will you insist on being simple minded?

How long will you mockers relish your mocking?

How long will you fools hate knowledge?

23 Come and listen to my counsel.

I'll share my heart with you and make you wise.

24 'I called you so often, but you wouldn't come.

I reached out to you, but you paid no attention.

25 You ignored my advice

and rejected the correction I offered.

26 So I will laugh when you are in trouble!

I will mock you when disaster overtakes you'"

27 when calamity overtakes you like a storm,
when disaster engulfs you like a cyclone,
and anguish and distress overwhelm you.

28 'When they cry for help, I will not answer.

Though they anxiously search for me, they will not find me.

29 For they hated knowledge and chose not to fear the Lord.

30 They rejected my advice and paid no attention when I corrected them.

31 Therefore, they must eat the bitter fruit of living their own way, choking on their own schemes.

32 For simpletons turn away from me to death.
Fools are destroyed by their own complacency.
33 But all who listen to me will live in peace,
untroubled by fear of harm.'

2:1 My child, listen to what I say, and treasure my commands.
2 Tune your ears to wisdom, and concentrate on understanding.
3 Cry out for insight, and ask for understanding.
4 Search for them as you would for silver; seek them like hidden treasures.
5 Then you will understand what it means to fear the Lord, and you will gain knowledge of God.
6 For the Lord grants wisdom!
From his mouth come knowledge and understanding.

2:9 Then you will understand what is right, just, and fair, and you will find the right way to go.10 For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will fill you with joy.11 Wise choices will watch over you.Understanding will keep you safe.

3:7 Don't be impressed with your own wisdom.Instead, fear the Lord and turn away from evil.8 Then you will have healing for your body

and strength for your bones.

3:13 Joyful is the person who finds wisdom, the one who gains understanding. 14 For wisdom is more profitable than silver, and her wages are better than gold. 15 Wisdom is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her. 16 She offers you long life in her right hand, and riches and honour in her left. 17 She will guide you down delightful paths; all her ways are satisfying. 18 Wisdom is a tree of life to those who embrace her; happy are those who hold her tightly. 19 By wisdom the Lord founded the earth; by understanding he created the heavens. 20 By his knowledge the deep fountains of the earth burst forth, and the dew settles beneath the night sky.

3:35 The wise inherit honour, but fools are put to shame!

4:5 Get wisdom; develop good judgment.

Don't forget my words or turn away from them.

6 Don't turn your back on wisdom, for she will protect you.

Love her, and she will guard you.

7 Getting wisdom is the wisest thing you can do!

And whatever else you do, develop good judgment.

8 If you prize wisdom, she will make you great.

Embrace her, and she will honour you.

9 She will place a lovely wreath on your head;
she will present you with a beautiful crown.'

8:1 Listen as Wisdom calls out!
Hear as understanding raises her voice!
2 On the hilltop along the road,
she takes her stand at the crossroads.
3 By the gates at the entrance to the town,
on the road leading in, she cries aloud,
4 "I call to you, to all of you!

I raise my voice to all people.

5 You simple people, use good judgment.

You foolish people, show some understanding.

6 Listen to me! For I have important things to tell you.

Everything I say is right,

7 for I speak the truth

and detest every kind of deception.

8 My advice is wholesome.

There is nothing devious or crooked in it.

- 9 My words are plain to anyone with understanding, clear to those with knowledge.
- 10 Choose my instruction rather than silver, and knowledge rather than pure gold.
- ${\bf 11}$ For wisdom is far more valuable than rubies.

Nothing you desire can compare with it.

12 "I, Wisdom, live together with good judgment.

I know where to discover knowledge and discernment.

13 All who fear the Lord will hate evil.

Therefore, I hate pride and arrogance, corruption and perverse speech.

14 Common sense and success belong to me.

Insight and strength are mine.

- 15 Because of me, kings reign, and rulers make just decrees.
- 16 Rulers lead with my help, and nobles make righteous judgments.
- 17 "I love all who love me.

Those who search will surely find me.

- 18 I have riches and honour, as well as enduring wealth and justice.
- 19 My gifts are better than gold, even the purest gold, my wages better than sterling silver!
- 20 I walk in righteousness, in paths of justice.
- 21 Those who love me inherit wealth.

I will fill their treasuries.

- 22 "The Lord formed me from the beginning, before he created anything else.
- 23 I was appointed in ages past, at the very first, before the earth began.

- 24 I was born before the oceans were created, before the springs bubbled forth their waters.
- 25 Before the mountains were formed, before the hills, I was born—
- 26 before he had made the earth and fields and the first handfuls of soil.
- 27 I was there when he established the heavens, when he drew the horizon on the oceans.
- 28 I was there when he set the clouds above, when he established springs deep in the earth.
- 29 I was there when he set the limits of the seas, so they would not spread beyond their boundaries.

And when he marked off the earth's foundations,

30 I was the architect at his side.

I was his constant delight, rejoicing always in his presence.

- 31 And how happy I was with the world he created; how I rejoiced with the human family!
- 32 "And so, my children, listen to me, for all who follow my ways are joyful.
- 33 Listen to my instruction and be wise. Don't ignore it.
- 34 Joyful are those who listen to me, watching for me daily at my gates, waiting for me outside my home!
- 35 For whoever finds me finds life and receives favor from the Lord.
- 36 But those who miss me injure themselves.
 All who hate me love death."
- 9:1 Wisdom has built her house; she has carved its seven columns.
- 2 She has prepared a great banquet, mixed the wines, and set the table.
- 3 She has sent her servants to invite everyone to come. She calls out from the heights overlooking the city.
- 4 "Come in with me," she urges the simple.

 To those who lack good judgment, she says,
- 5 "Come, eat my food, and drink the wine I have mixed.

- 6 Leave your simple ways behind, and begin to live; learn to use good judgment."
- 9:10 Fear of the Lord is the foundation of wisdom.

 Knowledge of the Holy One results in good judgment.
- 11 Wisdom will multiply your days and add years to your life.
- 12 If you become wise, you will be the one to benefit. If you scorn wisdom, you will be the one to suffer.
- 22:17 Listen to the words of the wise; apply your heart to my instruction.
- 18 For it is good to keep these sayings in your heart and always ready on your lips.
- 19 I am teaching you today—yes, you—so you will trust in the Lord.
- 20 I have written thirty sayings for you, filled with advice and knowledge.
- 21 In this way, you may know the truth and take an accurate report to those who sent you.
- 23: Commit yourself to instruction; listen carefully to words of knowledge.
- 24: 3 A house is built by wisdom and becomes strong through good sense.
- 4 Through knowledge its rooms are filled with all sorts of precious riches and valuables.
- 5 The wise are mightier than the strong, and those with knowledge grow stronger and stronger.
- 6 So don't go to war without wise guidance; victory depends on having many advisers.
- 7 Wisdom is too lofty for fools.

 Among leaders at the city gate, they have nothing to say.
- 24: 13 My child, eat honey, for it is good, and the honeycomb is sweet to the taste.14 In the same way, wisdom is sweet to your soul.

If you find it, you will have a bright future, and your hopes will not be cut short.

Folly

13 The woman named Folly is brash.

She is ignorant and doesn't know it.

14 She sits in her doorway on the heights overlooking the city.

15 She calls out to men going by who are minding their own business.

16 "Come in with me," she urges the simple.

To those who lack good judgment, she says,

17 "Stolen water is refreshing;

food eaten in secret tastes the best!"

18 But little do they know that the dead are there.

Her guests are in the depths of the grave.

Immoral Women

2:16 Wisdom will save you from the immoral woman, from the seductive words of the promiscuous woman.
17 She has abandoned her husband and ignores the covenant she made before God.
18 Entering her house leads to death; it is the road to the grave.
19 The man who visits her is doomed.

6: 24 It will keep you from the immoral woman, from the smooth tongue of a promiscuous woman.

25 Don't lust for her beauty.

Don't let her coy glances seduce you.

He will never reach the paths of life.

26 For a prostitute will bring you to poverty, but sleeping with another man's wife will cost you your life.

27 Can a man scoop a flame into his lap and not have his clothes catch on fire?

28 Can he walk on hot coals and not blister his feet?

29 So it is with the man who sleeps with another man's wife.

He who embraces her will not go unpunished.

- 30 Excuses might be found for a thief who steals because he is starving.
- 31 But if he is caught, he must pay back seven times what he stole, even if he has to sell everything in his house.
- 32 But the man who commits adultery is an utter fool, for he destroys himself.
- 33 He will be wounded and disgraced. His shame will never be erased.
- 34 For the woman's jealous husband will be furious, and he will show no mercy when he takes revenge.
- 35 He will accept no compensation, nor be satisfied with a payoff of any size.
- 7:4 Love wisdom like a sister; make insight a beloved member of your family.
- 5 Let them protect you from an affair with an immoral woman, from listening to the flattery of a promiscuous woman.
- 6 While I was at the window of my house, looking through the curtain,
- 7 I saw some naive young men, and one in particular who lacked common sense.
- 8 He was crossing the street near the house of an immoral woman, strolling down the path by her house.
- 9 It was at twilight, in the evening, as deep darkness fell.
- 10 The woman approached him, seductively dressed and sly of heart.
- 11 She was the brash, rebellious type, never content to stay at home.
- 12 She is often in the streets and markets, soliciting at every corner.
- 13 She threw her arms around him and kissed him, and with a brazen look she said,
- 14 "I've just made my peace offerings and fulfilled my vows.
- 15 You're the one I was looking for!
 I came out to find you, and here you are!
- 16 My bed is spread with beautiful blankets, with coloured sheets of Egyptian linen.

17 I've perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon.

18 Come, let's drink our fill of love until morning.

Let's enjoy each other's caresses,

19 for my husband is not home.

He's away on a long trip.

20 He has taken a wallet full of money with him and won't return until later this month."

21 So she seduced him with her pretty speech and enticed him with her flattery.

22 He followed her at once,

like an ox going to the slaughter.

He was like a stag caught in a trap,

23 awaiting the arrow that would pierce its heart.

He was like a bird flying into a snare,

little knowing it would cost him his life.

24 So listen to me, my sons, and pay attention to my words.

25 Don't let your hearts stray away toward her.

Don't wander down her wayward path.

26 For she has been the ruin of many; many men have been her victims.

27 Her house is the road to the grave.

Her bedroom is the den of death.

23:26 O my son, give me your heart.

May your eyes take delight in following my ways.

27 A prostitute is a dangerous trap;

a promiscuous woman is as dangerous as falling into a narrow well.

28 She hides and waits like a robber,

eager to make more men unfaithful.

Parents/Children

1:8 My child, listen when your father corrects you.

Don't neglect your mother's instruction.

9 What you learn from them will crown you with grace and be a chain of honour around your neck.

3:1 My child, never forget the things I have taught you.

Store my commands in your heart.

2 If you do this, you will live many years, and your life will be satisfying.

3:11 My child, don't reject the Lord's discipline,and don't be upset when he corrects you.12 For the Lord corrects those he loves,just as a father corrects a child in whom he delights.

4:1 My children, listen when your father corrects you. Pay attention and learn good judgment,
2 for I am giving you good guidance.
Don't turn away from my instructions.
3 For I, too, was once my father's son,
tenderly loved as my mother's only child.
4 My father taught me, 'Take my words to heart.
Follow my commands, and you will live.

4:10 My child, listen to me and do as I say, and you will have a long, good life.
11 I will teach you wisdom's ways and lead you in straight paths.
12 When you walk, you won't be held back; when you run, you won't stumble.
13 Take hold of my instructions; don't let them go. Guard them, for they are the key to life.

4:20 My child, pay attention to what I say.Listen carefully to my words.21 Don't lose sight of them.Let them penetrate deep into your heart,22 for they bring life to those who find them,and healing to their whole body.

7:1 Follow my advice, my son; always treasure my commands.

- 2 Obey my commands and live!
 Guard my instructions as you guard your own eyes.
- 3 Tie them on your fingers as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart.

- 23: 13 Don't fail to discipline your children.
 The rod of punishment won't kill them.
- 14 Physical discipline may well save them from death.
- 15 My child, if your heart is wise, my own heart will rejoice!
- 16 Everything in me will celebrate when you speak what is right.
- 23: 22 Listen to your father, who gave you life, and don't despise your mother when she is old.
- 23 Get the truth and never sell it; also get wisdom, discipline, and good judgment.
- 24 The father of godly children has cause for joy. What a pleasure to have children who are wise.
- 25 So give your father and mother joy! May she who gave you birth be happy.

Money

- 1:10 My child, if sinners entice you, turn your back on them!
- 1:18 ...these people set an ambush for themselves;they are trying to get themselves killed.19 Such is the fate of all who are greedy for money;it robs them of life.
- 3:9 Honor the Lord with your wealthand with the best part of everything you produce.10 Then he will fill your barns with grain,and your vats will overflow with good wine.
- 22:22 Don't rob the poor just because you can, or exploit the needy in court.
- 23 For the Lord is their defender. He will ruin anyone who ruins them.
- 22: 26 Don't agree to guarantee another person's debt

or put up security for someone else.

27 If you can't pay it,

even your bed will be snatched from under you.

23: Don't wear yourself out trying to get rich.

Be wise enough to know when to quit.

5 In the blink of an eye wealth disappears,

for it will sprout wings

and fly away like an eagle.

Honesty/Justice

2:7 He grants a treasure of common sense to the honest.

He is a shield to those who walk with integrity.

- 22: 28 Don't cheat your neighbor by moving the ancient boundary markers set up by previous generations.
- 23: 10 Don't cheat your neighbor by moving the ancient boundary markers; don't take the land of defenseless orphans.
- 11 For their Redeemer is strong;

he himself will bring their charges against you.

24: 11 Rescue those who are unjustly sentenced to die;

save them as they stagger to their death.

12 Don't excuse yourself by saying, "Look, we didn't know."

For God understands all hearts, and he sees you.

He who guards your soul knows you knew.

He will repay all people as their actions deserve.

24: 23 Here are some further sayings of the wise:

It is wrong to show favouritism when passing judgment.

24 A judge who says to the wicked, "You are innocent,"

will be cursed by many people and denounced by the nations.

25 But it will go well for those who convict the guilty;

rich blessings will be showered on them.

26 An honest answer

is like a kiss of friendship.

28 Don't testify against your neighbours without cause; don't lie about them.

29 And don't say, "Now I can pay them back for what they've done to me! I'll get even with them!"

Righteousness

2:8 He guards the paths of the just and protects those who are faithful to him.

2:20 Follow the steps of good men instead, and stay on the paths of the righteous.21 For only the godly will live in the land, and those with integrity will remain in it.

3:3 Never let loyalty and kindness leave you!Tie them around your neck as a reminder.Write them deep within your heart.4 Then you will find favour with both God and people, and you will earn a good reputation.

4:18 The way of the righteous is like the first gleam of dawn, which shines ever brighter until the full light of day.

Evil People

2:12 Wisdom will save you from evil people, from those whose words are twisted.13 These men turn from the right way to walk down dark paths.14 They take pleasure in doing wrong, and they enjoy the twisted ways of evil.15 Their actions are crooked, and their ways are wrong.

2:22 But the wicked will be removed from the land, and the treacherous will be uprooted.

3:31 Don't envy violent people or copy their ways.32 Such wicked people are detestable to the Lord, but he offers his friendship to the godly.

33 The Lord curses the house of the wicked, but he blesses the home of the upright.

4:14 Don't do as the wicked do,
and don't follow the path of evildoers.
15 Don't even think about it; don't go that way.
Turn away and keep moving.
16 For evil people can't sleep until they've done their evil deed for the day.
They can't rest until they've caused someone to stumble.
17 They eat the food of wickedness
and drink the wine of violence!

4:19 But the way of the wicked is like total darkness. They have no idea what they are stumbling over.

22: 24 Don't befriend angry people or associate with hot-tempered people,25 or you will learn to be like them and endanger your soul.

23:1 While dining with a ruler, pay attention to what is put before you.2 If you are a big eater, put a knife to your throat;3 don't desire all the delicacies,

for he might be trying to trick you.

23: 6 Don't eat with people who are stingy; don't desire their delicacies.

7 They are always thinking about how much it costs. "Eat and drink," they say, but they don't mean it.

8 You will throw up what little you've eaten, and your compliments will be wasted.

9 Don't waste your breath on fools, for they will despise the wisest advice.

23: 17 Don't envy sinners,but always continue to fear the Lord.18 You will be rewarded for this;

your hope will not be disappointed.

- 19 My child, listen and be wise:Keep your heart on the right course.20 Do not carouse with drunkards or feast with gluttons,21 for they are on their way to poverty, and too much sleep clothes them in rags.
- 24:1 Don't envy evil people or desire their company.2 For their hearts plot violence, and their words always stir up trouble.
- 24: 8 A person who plans evil will get a reputation as a troublemaker.9 The schemes of a fool are sinful; everyone detests a mocker.
- 24: 15 Don't wait in ambush at the home of the godly, and don't raid the house where the godly live.16 The godly may trip seven times, but they will get up again. But one disaster is enough to overthrow the wicked.
- 17 Don't rejoice when your enemies fall; don't be happy when they stumble.18 For the Lord will be displeased with you and will turn his anger away from them.
- 19 Don't fret because of evildoers;don't envy the wicked.20 For evil people have no future;the light of the wicked will be snuffed out.
- 21 My child, fear the Lord and the king.Don't associate with rebels,for disaster will hit them suddenly.Who knows what punishment will come from the Lord and the king?

Choices

3:5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. 6 Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take.

3:21 My child, don't lose sight of common sense and discernment. Hang on to them,
22 for they will refresh your soul.
They are like jewels on a necklace.
23 They keep you safe on your way,
and your feet will not stumble.
24 You can go to bed without fear;
you will lie down and sleep soundly.
25 You need not be afraid of sudden disaster
or the destruction that comes upon the wicked,
26 for the Lord is your security.
He will keep your foot from being caught in a trap.

4:25 Look straight ahead,and fix your eyes on what lies before you.26 Mark out a straight path for your feet;stay on the safe path.27 Don't get sidetracked;keep your feet from following evil.

Drinking

23: 29 Who has anguish? Who has sorrow?Who is always fighting? Who is always complaining?Who has unnecessary bruises? Who has bloodshot eyes?30 It is the one who spends long hours in the taverns, trying out new drinks.

- 31 Don't gaze at the wine, seeing how red it is, how it sparkles in the cup, how smoothly it goes down.
- 32 For in the end it bites like a poisonous snake; it stings like a viper.
- 33 You will see hallucinations, and you will say crazy things.
- 34 You will stagger like a sailor tossed at sea,

clinging to a swaying mast.

35 And you will say, "They hit me, but I didn't feel it.
I didn't even know it when they beat me up.

When will I wake up
so I can look for another drink?"

Relationships/Communication

3:27 Do not withhold good from those who deserve it when it's in your power to help them.
28 If you can help your neighbour now, don't say,
'Come back tomorrow, and then I'll help you.'
29 Don't plot harm against your neighbour,
for those who live nearby trust you.
30 Don't pick a fight without reason,
when no one has done you harm.

4:24 Avoid all perverse talk; stay away from corrupt speech.

9:7 Anyone who rebukes a mocker will get an insult in return.Anyone who corrects the wicked will get hurt.8 So don't bother correcting mockers;they will only hate you.But correct the wise,and they will love you.

9 Instruct the wise, and they will be even wiser. Teach the righteous, and they will learn even more.

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Work

22: 29 Do you see any truly competent workers?They will serve kingsrather than working for ordinary people.24: 10 If you fail under pressure,your strength is too small.

- 24: 27 Do your planning and prepare your fields before building your house.
- 30 I walked by the field of a lazy person, the vineyard of one with no common sense.
- 31 I saw that it was overgrown with nettles. It was covered with weeds, and its walls were broken down.
- 32 Then, as I looked and thought about it, I learned this lesson:
- 33 A little extra sleep, a little more slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—
- 34 then poverty will pounce on you like a bandit; scarcity will attack you like an armed robber.

Humility

3:34 The Lord mocks the mockers (opposes the proud) but is gracious to the humble.

Your Heart

4:23 Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life.

- 19:18 Discipline your children while there is hope. Otherwise you will ruin their lives.
- 19:26 Children who mistreat their father or chase away their mother are an embarrassment and a public disgrace.
- 20:6 Many will say they are loyal friends, but who can find one who is truly reliable?
- 20:7 The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children who follow them.
- 20:20 If you insult your father or mother, your light will be snuffed out in total darkness.
- 21:9 It's better to live alone in the corner of an attic than with a quarrelsome wife in a lovely home.
- 21:19 It's better to live alone in the desert than with a quarrelsome, complaining wife.
- 22:6 Direct your children onto the right path, and when they are older, they will not leave it.
- 25: 17 Don't visit your neighbors too often, or you will wear out your welcome.
- 25: It's better to live alone in the corner of an attic than with a quarrelsome wife in a lovely home.
- 27: 9 The heartfelt counsel of a friend is as sweet as perfume and incense.
- 10 Never abandon a friend—

either yours or your father's.

When disaster strikes, you won't have to ask your brother for assistance. It's better to go to a neighbor than to a brother who lives far away.

27: 15 A quarrelsome wife is as annoying as constant dripping on a rainy day.16 Stopping her complaints is like trying to stop the wind or trying to hold something with greased hands.

17 As iron sharpens iron, so a friend sharpens a friend.

Money/Generosity

10:2 Tainted wealth has no lasting value, but right living can save your life.

10:15 The wealth of the rich is their fortress; the poverty of the poor is their destruction.

10:16 The earnings of the godly enhance their lives, but evil people squander their money on sin.

10:22 The blessing of the Lord makes a person rich, and he adds no sorrow with it.

11:4 Riches won't help on the day of judgment, but right living can save you from death.

11:15 There's danger in putting up security for a stranger's debt; it's safer not to guarantee another person's debt.

11:16 A gracious woman gains respect, but ruthless men gain only wealth.

11:18 Evil people get rich for the moment, but the reward of the godly will last.

11:24 Give freely and become more wealthy; be stingy and lose everything.

- 11:25 The generous will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed.
- 11:26 People curse those who hoard their grain, but they bless the one who sells in time of need.
- 11:28 Trust in your money and down you go! But the godly flourish like leaves in spring.
- 12:12 Thieves are jealous of each other's loot, but the godly are well rooted and bear their own fruit.

- 16:26 It is good for workers to have an appetite;

- an empty stomach drives them on.

- 18:9 A lazy person is as bad as someone who destroys things.
- 19:15 Lazy people sleep soundly, but idleness leaves them hungry.
- 19:24 Lazy people take food in their hand but don't even lift it to their mouth.
- 20:4 Those too lazy to plow in the right season will have no food at the harvest.

 Keep your eyes open, and there will be plenty to eat!

 Don't eat too much, or it will make you sick!
- 26: 13 The lazy person claims, "There's a lion on the road! Yes, I'm sure there's a lion out there!"
- 14 As a door swings back and forth on its hinges, so the lazy person turns over in bed.
- 15 Lazy people take food in their hand but don't even lift it to their mouth.

- 16 Lazy people consider themselves smarter than seven wise counselors.
- 27: 18 As workers who tend a fig tree are allowed to eat the fruit, so workers who protect their employer's interests will be rewarded.
- 27: 23 Know the state of your flocks, and put your heart into caring for your herds,
- 24 for riches don't last forever, and the crown might not be passed to the next generation.
- 25 After the hay is harvested and the new crop appears and the mountain grasses are gathered in,
- 26 your sheep will provide wool for clothing, and your goats will provide the price of a field.
- 27 And you will have enough goats' milk for yourself, your family, and your servant girls.
- 28: 19 A hard worker has plenty of food, but a person who chases fantasies ends up in poverty.
- 20 The trustworthy person will get a rich reward, but a person who wants quick riches will get into trouble.

- 15:17 A bowl of vegetables with someone you love is better than steak with someone you hate.
- 15:18 A hot-tempered person starts fights; a cool-tempered person stops them.
- 17:1 Better a dry crust eaten in peace than a house filled with feasting—and conflict.
- 17:9 Love prospers when a fault is forgiven, but dwelling on it separates close friends.
- 17:12 It is safer to meet a bear robbed of her cubs

than to confront a fool caught in foolishness.

- 17:13 If you repay good with evil, evil will never leave your house.
- 17:14 Starting a quarrel is like opening a floodgate, so stop before a dispute breaks out.
- 17:19 Anyone who loves to quarrel loves sin; anyone who trusts in high walls invites disaster.
- 18:1 Unfriendly people care only about themselves; they lash out at common sense.
- 18:18 Flipping a coin can end arguments; it settles disputes between powerful opponents.
- 18:19 An offended friend is harder to win back than a fortified city. Arguments separate friends like a gate locked with bars.
- 19:11 Sensible people control their temper; they earn respect by overlooking wrongs.
